# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT Spring 2022

s I sit here at the end of storm Eunice with continuing high winds and waiting for the arrival of storm Franklin; please forgive me that it does not feel much like spring is on the way. That being said mother nature does appear to be waking up and colour is arriving thank Heavens

### **Rail Freight Community Funding:**

Thank you everyone for your suggestions for the betterment of the village which will be considered by your Parish Council. This year we'll be formulating our applications for the available funding and will keep you updated.

### **The Poor's Trust:**

In my last Chairman's report, I confirmed that The Parish Council had been told by the then Trustees that they were resigning. I'd like to make it clear that the Parish Council received their resignations at the end of July 2021, and we thank them for their exemplary service.

As of yet we've not had anyone approach us and I would ask again for those who would be so minded to step forward to be considered for the role of Trustee & provide much needed support for your community. This is not a time onerous role, and you would be supported by the Parish Council. Please remember this is a village and a village is only as good as the community within it. I'm sure there are plenty of you who have a little time to spare to help. Please do contact us for further details.

### **Planning Applications:**

1. Northampton Gateway Logistics Park (SEGRO): I informed you in my last missive that SEGRO had made a late application (Ref: WNS/2021/1860/MAF) regarding the first warehouse near to the A508. Our objections on your behalf have been submitted.

There have been several other planning notifications made since my Winter Report and these are listed in our Minutes for your review.

# **Leys Field Public Footpath Access:**

If you recall we've been in contact with the Land Agent to the owner of the Leys Field regarding making repairs/tidying up the entrance to the field from the stile end at the junction of High Street and Rectory Lane. We also contacted NCC, given the public footpath, about this matter but were told in no uncertain terms that they don't believe the matter is of their concern.

#### **Milton Rats:**

After some considerable work chasing Anglian Water, they've finally confirmed that the wall supporting the manhole access to the drainage pipes was damaged which gave easy access for Rats to come overground. Living in a rural community it's not surprising that we're visited by all creatures, but it has become quite a problem for the High Street/Green Street/Orchard Close area. We have made enquiries with an 'expert' to try to bring the population under more control.

### **Car Parking:**

We've noticed a significant increase in cars and vans parking on pavements and pedestrian areas. This is damaging the pavements, kerb stones and green areas. This increase may be correlated to an increase in works going on within the village. Please consider those with children, pushchairs or the disabled who are forced into the road to get around these vehicles. It is your responsibility to marshal your contractors to make sure they're acting reasonably. If they can't park safely in the road due to the width of the road, then they MUST park somewhere else regardless of if it is inconvenient for them.

# Milton Malsor Village Defibrillator

We are very lucky to have a community Defibrillator that is located on the main gates to the Primary School.

It is in a locked cabinet.

Should you need the Defibrillator the 999 Operator will give you the code.

They will also guide you through CPR and the Defibrillator will give you verbal instructions on how to use it and there are picture instruction as to where to put the pads.

The Defibrillator also has as set of Paediatric pads with it should it be

needed for a child. There is also a pouch with scissors, razor, flannel, a wipe and a mouth guard.

The Defibrillator is checked on a weekly basis by the Guardian.

#### DOG FOULING

Once again we write to ask dog owners who do not pick up their dog's waste to please do so, it is a serious health hazard and can harm children if they accidentally come into contact with it.

There are people who do not pick up in the Jitty running between Green Street and Rectory Lane, it is not a pleasant walk through there, so clear up after your dog. The large green skip in the Compass Yard which is full of rubbish now has many bags full of dog 'poo' hanging out of it, it is not a pretty sight. The Parish Council have been trying to get this skip removed for some time and the dumping of bagged dog waste into it has made matters worse.

The Parish Council pays over £1,000 per year from the Precept for the seven dog waste bins around the village to be emptied, there are plenty around so dump the waste in them that's what they are there for or use your own black bin.

Be proud of where you live and look after our environment, your money pays for the dog waste bins so use them.

#### From The Editor

In numerous previous editions of this Newsletter, I have been asked to find space by the Parish Council to highlight the nuisance and dangers caused by a minority of dog owners who do not clear up mess left by their dogs in and around the village.

That message is clearly falling on deaf ears, as yet again am having to make space available in this edition on the same subject.

The time has now come to identify those responsible. To that end, I am reproducing in red below a section from the West Northamptonshire Council Website (South Northamptonshire Area) relating to their page headlined "REPORTING DOG FOULING" Policy.

"It is an offence if the owner of a dog allows their animal to foul in a public place without clearing it up.

If a council officer or any other authorised officer witnesses you not cleaning up after your dog, you may be given a <u>fixed penalty of £50.</u> If you refuse to pay the fixed penalty you may be taken to court and be fined up to £1000 plus court costs.

If you witness someone letting their dog foul in a public place without cleaning it up afterwards, you should report this to us. Include the name and address of the person in charge of the dog (if known), a description of the dog, plus details of the date, time and place of the offence."

If anyone witnessing this behaviour feels uncomfortable in reporting it to the council directly they can approach any member of the Parish Council or the Parish Council Office who will be happy to advise and assist. The website link to this message is;
